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Top Marks for Food Hygiene with SCE Enterprise

The Royal Environmental Health Institute of Scotland (REHIS) has awarded a credit pass to 62.5% of course participants at SCE Enterprise on the Intermediate Food Hygiene Course compared to a national average of 12% credit pass rate.

The course provides an understanding of the relationship between food hygiene, food poisoning and food spoilage, the socio-economic costs of poor food hygiene and the role hazard analysis in ensuring food safety.

Candidates must get 80% or over in the written examination and to achieve five credit passes in one exam is rare."
